# *Pastor's Note*

## *A Lenten Invitation to Pray the Lord's Prayer, three times a day!*

As you read this we are quietly moving toward *Lent* in this year of our Lord, 2011. *Lent* is the church season, which begins on Ash Wednesday, March 9, and will flow for 40 days plus Sundays, culminating in the great and wondrous celebration of Easter Sunday, April 24! This is a time to muster increased attention to the spiritual dimension - such things as prayer, study, intentional devotion - in preparation for embracing the great gift at the center of our faith.

A personal anecdote from my past illustrates the significance of this reminder... It was Spring, 1997, in my first year of non-parish based ministry as Executive Director of The Kerygma Bible Study Program. It had been a vigorous time, learning new ropes and moving to different rhythms. On a mid week morning I fielded a phone call, when the pastor remarked she was preparing for that night's Ash Wednesday service.

*GULP and STOP RIGHT THERE!*

It was the gateway to Lent all right - and for the first time in 17 years I had not noted it. The shock of that mid day stays with me, and the realization that outside of my pastoral role how easy it was to get swept along by the regular marking of time - a regular guy, just like most of the rest of the world.

So, here's the punch line and the pitch - in my pastoral role, I encourage you to remember that underneath the passing of days, there is another way to mark our moments. We call it the church calendar, God's time, which has as a prominent season, this term in which we now find ourselves. I encourage you to make note. Plan ways to keep more diligently attuned. In this season set aside for personal preparation - do some! Be in worship without fail. Join in our Lord's Prayer study. Take on the discipline of 'giving something up' to remind you of who and whose you are.

Pray more regularly. In fact, why *not take on the discipline of praying the Lord's Prayer three times a day*. Our Roman Catholic friends remind themselves with the sign of the cross. Our Islamic neighbors pray toward Mecca five times daily. The disciplines help anchor them in their expressions of faith. And this season you can be anchored too: *pray The Lord's Prayer - in the morning, at noon and at night*. Pray with slow attention to the phrases. If you get distracted, stop, and start over. Let our Lord's spirit speak to you, settle into you, to shape and mold the day and the season.

As you read this we are moving quietly into *Lent*. I invite you to pray the Lord's Prayer three times a day. You will grow closer to God, and to your own best self, as you do!

# Christian Formation . . .

We have a lot going on in Christian Formation as we move toward spring! Already, many of our summer program dates have been set so be sure to mark your calendars!

## In Sunday School:

The Winter Season of Sunday school continues now through March 6. The second and third grade students are working to memorize the Gloria Patri, the Doxology and the Lord's Prayer.

Teachers are needed for the Spring Season starting March 13 in these classes: 4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup>, and every other week in the 2<sup>nd</sup>/3<sup>rd</sup> class. A pre-K teacher team is needed to teach March-May on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of each month. Please prayerfully consider whether you are able to teach this spring.

There will be no Sunday school classes on Palm Sunday, April 17 or Easter Sunday, April 24. Children are encouraged to attend worship with their parents.

An Egg Hunt will take place following worship on Palm Sunday (weather permitting).

One Great Hour of Sharing Fish Banks will be distributed in Sunday school classrooms on Sunday, March 20. Each bank will be accompanied by a calendar that includes great suggestions on offerings for each day. Banks will be collected on Palm Sunday, April 17 during the children's conversation.

In April, PYC is happy to prepare one of the Lenten Soup Suppers on April 6 (in lieu of Sunday programming that week).

Looking way ahead to summer: we will be going to Six Flags Great Adventure on Saturday, June 11 for the Summer Launch Party (sponsored by the Christian radio station Star 99.1). It will be a day full of rides, food, and music by the Christian rock group *Mercy Me*.



## In Adult Education:

We will have a guest speaker from Interfaith Dialogue Center (IDC) join us on Sunday, March 13 following fellowship time at about 11:30 a.m. to speak about basic faith practices of Islam.

On Sunday, April 3, we will be joined by Julia Thorne, immigration attorney for PC(USA). Following fellowship time, she will be speaking about "just-immigration policy" and what that means for the PC (USA).

A Lenten Bible Study will be ongoing throughout the season, led by our Pastor, Nick Van Gombos: Wednesday evenings at 7:30 (dinner at 7) starting March 16 and Sunday mornings at 8:30 starting March 13.

## In Confirmation:

The Confirmation class concluded its study of "We Believe" in February and students have completed their statements of faith. In March and April, confirmation students and adult chaperones will visit a number of churches in the area including First Baptist Church of South Orange, St. Demetrios Greek Orthodox Church in Union, Riverside Church, NYC, and St. Rose of Lima in Short Hills. In addition, Confirmation students will participate in the Interfaith Dialogue Center visit to WPC on March 13. Confirmation this year will be held on Sunday, June 12 (Pentecost).

### In Appalachia Service Project Youth Mission Trip Set for July 2—9, 2011:

The preparations for the summer 2011 trip are underway. There is still room for both youth and adult participants. Appalachia Service Project is a non-profit organization that utilizes the work of 13,000 volunteers per year to make homes 'safer, warmer, drier' for people and families in the Appalachia region.

Mark your calendars: fundraisers for ASP begin soon. We will have our annual Mother's Day Cake Auction on Sunday, May 8 following worship, Stock Certificates will be sold through-

out May, and a Yard Sale on Saturday, June 4. Last year our church sent 20 participants to Buchanan County, Virginia – one of the 100 poorest counties in the country. While there, our 3 work teams repaired a kitchen floor, insulated and put new walls in a kitchen, a put up new dormers and vents on a roof. All this in just 5 days of work!

Let's make this year equally successful.



## REPORT FROM THE SESSION CLERK

Presented at the 2011 Annual Meeting of the Congregation and reprinted here.

2010, A year of abundant and profound changes in the life of Wyoming Church.

We are truly blessed to have a Mission committed congregation that supports our surrounding communities, as well as the world. Locally, we served over 400 meals at Thanksgiving, sent bags and bags of clothes to Elizabeth Coalition, sent Christmas gifts to the Cleveland school, supported the House of Mercy Mission, the Greater Abyssinian Church. Made countless lunches for our monthly feeding program for Clinton Avenue Church, our endless meals and overnights in support of IHN, Camperships to Camp Johnsonburg, *Operation Warmheart*, a program for homeless men, the countless hours in the Pumpkin Patch and our commitment to Living Waters, for after all, clean water is a basic right of all people. And the list goes on and on...

Christian Formation ran a successful Sunday School program serving 123 children and Confirmed seven new members in May. PYC and Friday Frogs met regularly for games, bowling, movies, discussions and dinner. 20+ attended the Mission trip to Virginia, then in early August a Veggie Tale themed VBS attracted 42 children, a record number. There are two Women's Bible studies that meet faithfully on Wednesdays and our Adult Education program was infused with some new energy this year with several stimulating speakers. A new group, MiniMissionaries was formed by Katrina Elia and Cynthia Tratnyek to help nurture the giving spirit in our preK to 5<sup>th</sup> Graders.

Our Deacons provided an ever present refuge in the lives of those in our congregation who faced need whether from loss, sickness or joy. They served at three funerals and provided countless meals and conversations as well as shoulders to cry on and extra hands to pray. If you are not sure who they are, you can greet them each Sunday in the Narthex.

Our Open Door Nursery School continues to fill the church on a weekday basis with smiling and laughing children. This past summer, they also completed the surface of the playground so that our littlest members have a safe and secure place to play.

In June, we explored the relevancy of our relationship with the Presbytery and hope to continue our dialogue with them.

WPC is currently supporting a grass roots effort by Min

Lee to develop a Korean ministry within WPC with the hope that it can develop.

Each Sunday we enjoy beautiful music from our Chancel Choir, led by Steven Shellman, soloists both vocal and instrumental and, of course, our ever popular children's choirs. We are grateful to Debbie Jacoby, Victoria Haas, and Judy Reese for so ably keeping these programs alive in the fall as Kathy Innis took a leave of absence.

The women of the church, Soulfood, held their annual retreat in Spring Lake. For 24 women, it was a weekend of rest and renewal, fun and fellowship.

Our Celebrations committee was very busy supplying opportunities for all of us to get to know one another better. A Progressive dinner, a barbecue to welcome Nick and Franny, a delicious Stewardship Brunch, an applefest to kick off the fall season, Sights and Sounds of Christmas are just a few of the wonderful events in which this dedicated group is involved.

We want to thank our staff, Judy Tharaud, Jessica Crane Munoz, Steven Shellman, and Kathy Innis for their continued care of our congregation. We said good bye and thank you to our sexton, David White. We also wish to thank our many volunteers who perform necessary tasks behind the scenes. Without you, we would not be the Wyoming Presbyterian Church we are.

And to you, our faithful members, we sincerely thank you. You truly exemplify the definition of discipleship by taking part in the common life and worship of our church, by supporting the work of Wyoming Presbyterian Church both financially and with your time.

In 2010, the hard work of the PNC came to an end with the installation of our Pastor Nick Van Gombos on October 24. For the first time in 36 years, WPC has a new installed pastor. We are thankful for the interim preaching of Lou Kilgore who wrapped up his time with us on July 25. We are grateful to him for helping us to see that we are a congregation ready for change, ready to do new things.
